


Part 2. Stock's Historic Buildings, continued.

The last building of interest I shall deal with is the "Bear" Inn, which stands on one side of the "Square". This is a very old Inn, being mentioned in the Manor Court Rolls as early as 1577, It is a 16th century building to a "T" shaped plan, the crossing being at the back, being timber framed and plastered. There are some modern additions at the back.
