Cllr. Grundy had advised the Clerk that there are potholes appearing all over the place and it is important these are reported. Cllr. Grundy asked that Councillors report any potholes they see to Highways using their website. Cllr. Woodward agreed to carry out a full Stock survey. The Chairman gave the Clerk a list of potholes to be reported and a blocked drain in Whites Hill. Cllr. 2321.	<p><b>GENERAL CORRESPONDENCE.</b></p> <p>The following letters were read out:-</p> <p>a) Mrs Elizabeth Foster writing to complain about the refuse, wheelie bins &amp; recycling bins which are still being left out on pavement's throughout Stock village. There is a large refuse bin which has been left on the road outside the flower shop (number 38 High Street) which is on the road into Back Lane and it restricts the space available for cars and is a danger to pedestrians by blocking the walk way. Cllr. Otter stated that PCSO Fleming had said that this was a footway obstruction. It was agreed that the Clerk should write to Mrs Foster acknowledging the letter and advising her that the Parish Council were dealing with the matter the best way they could. It was agreed that an article should be put into Stock Press asking parishioners to be vigilant and not to leave out wheelie bins as they were an obstruction to the Highway. It was agreed that the Parish Council would monitor the situation and if it did not improve they would write to the relevant houseowners.</p> <p>b) Mrs West requested that a grit bin is installed in Birch Lane as there are five areas in and around Birch Lane that become particularly hazardous:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) Adjacent to the junction with Myln Meadow</li> <li>(2) Faulkner Close - sloped</li> <li>(3) The turning point adjacent to numbers 22-26 Birch Lane</li> <li>(4) The slope at the end of Birch Lane (from 30 to the end of the lane).</li> <li>(5) The entrance to Birch Lane from Common Road</li> </ol> <p>Mrs West would suggest a location adjacent to the electrical station on the corner of Myln Meadow as then it would be easily accessible to residents of Myln Meadow, Faulkner Close and Birch Lane and have close proximity to Common Road. A parishioner, Mr Tolaini, endorsed Mrs West's request.</p> <p>The Clerk had contacted Highways who advised that upon assessment of Birch Lane and surrounding roads for a salt bin, she felt that this location does not meet the requirement of being a hazardous location i.e. double bend or severe incline and does not agree to permission being given to a bin at this location.</p> <p>With reference to the Clerk's question about liabilities of spreading salt she referred to the following paragraph below:-</p> <p>For the purposes of liability and insurance the County Council and its agents will take responsibility for the salt bin and its contents after it has been installed. However, should the sponsor contract a third party, or instruct or oblige any employee to use the contents of the bin then they could be held liable in the result of any incident. However should members of the public take it upon themselves to spread some salt/grit as necessary then the County Council will take responsibility for the salt bin and its contents.</p> <p>The Clerk had sent a copy of the reply to Mrs West who had subsequently written to Mr Gregory at ECC advising that she had learnt from a neighbour that there has previously been a Salt/Grit bin located in Birch Lane and that it was removed by the council after residents started to remove salt to treat their own areas of the road. On that basis, presumably the council should have been gritting the area themselves as a Grit bin was provided.</p>	<b>CLERK</b>

Mrs West requested that representative of the Council visit Birch Lane, Myln Meadow and Faulkner Close the next time that there is snow and ice and they would see that the camber of the road and the various inclines do indeed make it hazardous for both vehicles and pedestrians (there is no pavement along various stretches of these roads).

Furthermore, if it was suitable for a grit bin in the past, surely it would be eligible now and therefore it should be the decision of individuals as to whether they wish to run the risk of being sued for gritting the road in the event of an accident. In this litigious society we run the risk of never doing anything to help anyone in case we might be sued. Surely common sense must prevail otherwise the council would not be gritting roads themselves in case they were sued by drivers who had accidents on those roads.

The council has also gritted the pavements in Stock High Street - does that make them liable if someone falls as opposed to not liable if they left the pavements in a dangerous untreated condition? Stock Parish Council has advised that they prefer the option of leaving areas untreated (and therefore more dangerous) than running the risk of litigation. As an individual, Mrs West preferred the common sense option. Technically, if she were to be sued, she has legal fees insurance and similarly, the Council has public liability insurance for just this circumstance.

To conclude, on the basis that a Salt bin has been provided in the past by the council, please arrange to visit the location where you would indeed find several bends and inclines, and possibly talk to some of the residents, one of whom parked adjacent to the Common rather than trying to get out of Myln Meadow in ice-rink conditions.

It was agreed that an article would be put into Stock Press advising parishioners that the Parish Council would not be holding Bin It Day but please clear around your property.
- i) Jackie Apps, Senior Manager, of Victim Support requesting a donation towards their organisation. It was agreed that it was not the Parish Council's policy to support these organisations.
- j) Darren Smart, Mobile Library Service Co-ordinator advising that the Mobile Library will be visiting Orchard House between 9.20am and 9.50am on 8<sup>th</sup> & 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 5<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> February, 5<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> March, 16<sup>th</sup> & 30<sup>th</sup> April, 14<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup> May and 11<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> June. The Clerk had notified Stock Press and Roger Watling for the website. A copy had also been put onto the noticeboard.
- k) Mr Cansick regarding the water running out of the ditch at the junction of Mill Road/Downham Road. With the recent bad weather the build-up of ice has resulted in heavy rutting and as the visibility at the junction is not great it is dangerous. Also the water running down Downham Road and across to the junction with Great Prestons Lane makes exiting the lane also hazardous especially in view of the speed of traffic in Downham Road. The Clerk had reported the matter to Highways.
- l) Sarah Brown of Highways advising of a temporary road closure in Goatsmoor Lane between 15<sup>th</sup> February to 19<sup>th</sup> February whilst BT renew aerial cables. The road will be closed from the junction with Potash Road in a generally easterly direction for a distance of approximately 525m. The alternative route will be via Potash Road, Stock Road, Mill Road, Whites Hill, Furze Lane, Goatsmoor Lane and vice versa.

Phillips reported that he was concerned that Whiteholme in Mill Road and Mill Cottage in Mill Road could be demolished now that the owners had passed away. Cllr. Phillips asked the Parish Council to consider writing to the owners notifying them that the Parish Council are going to approach English Heritage to get the properties listed. It was agreed that Cllr. Phillips would seek advice from James Bettley and report back at the next meeting.</p> <p>Cllr. Otter reported that she had noticed that the back of the Pavilion had been cleared but was concerned to see a metal gate on the Common together with a picket fence at the side of the Pavilion. Cllr. Woodward advised that this was to stop vehicles driving onto the Common and advised that no trees had been cut back. At the end of the bowling season the undergrowth will be cut down and the tree will be cut back which permission had been granted for. Cllr. Woodward advised that the fence had been erected following the generosity of one of the members. He advised that permission had been received from Lord Petre for the erection of the fence and that the picket fence has been erected as the nursery may be using it for a play area.</p>	
<p>2325.</p>	<p><b>DISCUSSION ITEMS.</b></p> <p><b>Parish Charter Consultation</b> – The Chairman advised that the Consultation was going to cabinet next week and was likely to be approved. He felt it was a common sense approach to parties working together. Cllr. Otter stated that she did not see any reason why the Parish Council should sign up to the scheme.</p> <p><b>Grass Cutting Contract 2010/12</b> – It was agreed that the Clerk would send out tenders to Blackwater Landscapes, Pinnacle, CBC Park Services, M.D. Landscapes and Mark Henderson. Tenders to be back to Clerk by 19<sup>th</sup> February 2010.</p> <p><b>Stock Library</b> – The Chairman advised that he had heard back from Lord Hanningfield’s office and he had appointed someone at ECC to be the contact. A meeting had therefore been agreed for the 8<sup>th</sup> February. The Chairman had invited Jenny Berkley to attend the meeting as a principal user. The lease, maintenance and running costs etc would be discussed. If the costs were reasonable then the project would be considered but if it was extortionate the plan would have to be reconsidered. The Chairman advised that it was just a fact finding exercise at this stage. Lord Hanningfield had advised that ECC were looking favourably at helping the Parish Council take the old library over for community use. It was agreed that a note would be put in Stock Press advising that the Parish Council were progressing the proposal of taking over the old library and a meeting had been arranged with ECC.</p> <p><b>Replacement Bus Shelter</b> – The Chairman had attended a meeting with ECC regarding replacing the bus shelter opposite The Hoop. ECC had agreed that they would look to raise the kerb to make it more wheelchair/pram friendly. The Chairman had sent the plans to ECC and they had agreed that the shelter should have its back to the hedge and bus shelter users sit facing the road as there is insufficient clearance to have it the other way round. The Chairman asked Cllr. Johnson to speak to the house owner asking if the shelter could be put 1ft into their ground.</p> <p><b>Removal of Groups from Parish Paths Partnership (P3) Scheme</b> – The letter revising the terms of the P3 scheme has been withdrawn immediately by Cllr. Norman Hume – it having been sent out without his knowledge, authority or proper consultation. Cllr. Hume has ordered that a full and proper consultation with County Councillors and respective Parish Councils will be carried out. It is intended that the aim should be to work with the Parishes to achieve a better balance between voluntary work and contracted cutting work and to ensure that best use is made of this stream of funding. Cllr. Finch had met with Matthew Hopkins of P3. Cllr. Finch had suggested that Mr Hopkins wrote an article for Stock Press to try and get volunteers to help on the footpaths.
