<p>Parking at Hereward Meadow – Lynn McLay-Kidd of CBC had advised the Clerk that apart from any issue of funding being available, as discussed previously they have no funding as this site was completed in accordance with the planning permission, although the Parish may have access to funds that she is unaware of - there is the problem of the principle of an access at this point. There was considerable concern from ECC Highways over them using the maintenance access off Honeypot Lane at the time of the application.</p>	
<p>Mrs McLay-Kidd passed the Parish Council’s request to them sometime ago and have chased them, but has heard nothing – it may be worthwhile the Parish Council also chasing them, Richard Cilvert at Country Highways. From a brief phone conversation they would not consider an entrance that had more use than their existing maintenance access which is only used max 4 times a year, so in principle a car park would not be considered. Mrs McLay-Kidd is not sure if it is still with him, as they have had a shake up recently. She too will also chase again.</p>	
<p>On a positive note- Mrs McLay-Kidd wonders if the Parish Council would like to meet with -herself and the NEAT officer to look at helping with some kind of activity morning on the site next Easter. which could be advertised in the village and the parish newsletter/ local schools and could include some planting and free activities, such as mini beast hunting, make a bird box/bat box for the site, plant some wildflower plugs on the area. Its seems small scale but if well advertised encourages people to walk and enjoy the space. This may help more people in the village realise it is there and where they have done similar things elsewhere shows a new level of support, it works really well in school hols.</p>

They have already carried out jetting works to this area this year and located some private drainage systems which did not appear to link together to form any sort of system. In the main they have undertaken inspections/work to a private system which is slightly more than expected than their current responsibility as the end of Common Lane is not adopted highway. They are, however, as local authority allowed to discharge highway surface water into private watercourses and systems.</p>

	<p>ECC and Southend-on-Sea Borough Council – Joint Waste Development Document Issues and Options Paper (October 2010) Consultation –</p> <p>The Parish Council commented that Waste Disposal is heavily dependent on road transport and as a consequence any site developed must be closely adjacent to the major highway network and not be dependent on local roads.</p> <p>The Parish Council are concerned that Essex County Council are not looking to export their waste management issues to other adjacent areas but continue to accept others regions waste into the county.</p> <p>Planning Contributions for Local Amenities – Cllr. Grundy had spoken to Joy Thomas at CBC who advised that there is £2,600.00 available for Stock with another £1,193.00 owed to the Council at present. Mrs Thomas has written to the developer recently requesting this payment. If the Parish Council has identified a project that they want to spend this money on, she will need to be advised of the details, with the cost, including evidence of the breakdown of such costs, and what funding they may have available to them as well.</p> <p>Agreed that proposals to be submitted to CBC for the short to medium term for improvements to the children’s play area (slide), and for the mid to long term the proposals would be for allotment provision and sports playing fields. It was acknowledged that the sums of money are likely to be small.</p> <p>Site Allocations Development Plan Document (SADPD) – Proposed Submission. The Parish Council welcomes the support to the Green Belt within the policy, and also the tight drawing of the DSB around the village. The Parish Council supports and welcomes the changes to the Protected Lanes within the parish. The Parish Council supports the proposed housing within the Brookmans Road area, but has serious concerns about the access to this site from the main road (B1007). The only access is via Back Lane which is single carriageway for part of its length and is already a substantial route to the school and pre-school in the area. It is likely that congestion could flow back on to the main B1007.</p> <p>Sandon Village Design Statement Supplementary Planning Document. The Parish Council has no comment.</p> <p>Danbury Planning Framework Supplementary Planning Document. 	<p>Budget and Precept 2010/11 – The Chairman circulated a draft budget document. It was agreed that the Precept should remain at £40000.00 and the Chairman asked for ideas for future Parish Council projects.</p> <p>Annual Donations – Carried forward to next meeting.</p>	CLERK
2470.	<p>COUNCILLOR/CLERK’S REPORT.</p> <p>Cllr. Otter had attended the Passenger Transport meeting on 3 November. Discussions included Community Transport and Concessionary fares. There was overwhelming support for concessions to be available from 9.00 am and for companion travel, but less support for Rail travel concessions. There will be major changes to National Express rail services from 12 December and people were advised to check the website for full details.</p> <p>Additional services are to be added to the 100 route on 4, 11, and 18 December between Billericay and Lakeside.</p> <p>The Parish Forum meeting on 11 November had been quite well attended although the earlier scheduled meeting had been cancelled. The meeting focused on the current consultations. It was advised that for a trial period enforcement details would be available on the CBC website especially for Parish Councillors. A password is needed for access and details are to be obtained. There was also discussion on Permitted Development Rights and further changes to the website were announced.</p> <p>Cllr. Grundy advised that the festive lights were now on in Chelmsford. Details were awaited on the Government Grants for next year. Once received work could begin on the effects this could have on front line services. He had thanked Highways for their works so far in Stock, and now commented that efforts must be directed to The Square as a priority area.</p> <p>Localism will be the issue for next year, details awaited.</p> <p>Food waste will be a recycling issue next year and there may well be other changes to waste collection as household patterns change.</p> <p>Chelmsford is now a very busy station with extra and longer trains now a feature. There is potential for the area to be used as a feeder to the Olympics being explored using Park and Ride facilities and the rail services. The new Park and Ride north of Chelmsford will open next April.</p> <p>Cllr. Millernas enquired regarding the use of Broadband for plans, could this now be completed.</p>	
2471.	<p>DISCUSSION ITEMS.</p> <p>Replacement Bus Shelter – The new bus shelter had now been installed. Comment received that it does not provide as much shelter as the original, but also many favourable comments had been received.</p> <p>Allotments – Nothing further to report.</p> <p>Stock Library – Following the public meeting Cllrs commented on the proposal. Cllr. Millernas did not see the scheme as viable. Cllr. Johnson was split down the middle, wanting the scheme but concerned on usage and cost. Cllr. Finch did not consider the proposition viable to run at a profit. Cllr. Rilstone could not see value other than to the Heritage Society. Cllr. Otter considered the site had opportunities but the numbers did not add up, and was also concerned with the condition of the building. Cllr. Phillips thought that usage would expand through time and the Parish Council should go for the building. The Chairman concluded that he considered the building could be an asset for the village but there had been no support for it other than from the Heritage Society. Indeed there had been quite strong opposition to the proposal from a number of quarters in the village. Whilst the heart said proceed the mind said no. Cllr. Phillips advised that the Mill Volunteers also support the use of the building. The Chairman therefore proposed to write to the agents saying the Parish Council could not make a financial case at the price demanded which was considered to be excessive. He would also challenge the principle that ECC who were donated the building should now be attempting to profit from the exercise and that the building should be provided at no cost to the village for the Heritage Society. Cllr Grundy is still seeking a meeting with Cllr Jeremy Lucas of ECC to discuss the issue. It was agreed to take no action for a few days to explore these last avenues.</p> <p>Youth Club – Nothing to report.</p> <p>Parish Council Elections – To be discussed at the next meeting.</p>	

	<p>Salt Bins – All existing bins will be filled at the start of the winter season. However, due to the potential salt availability difficulties of last year being repeated it may mean that ECC can not guarantee to refill any of the salt bins beyond the first fill at the start of the season. The Winter Operational Plan is being amended to reflect their position that ‘they will refill only when sufficient salt supplies are available which can be spared without affecting the reserves necessary to protect the primary network’. A definitive message has been sent out to all district managers informing them to cancel all requests and orders placed but not committed for new salt bins. The ECC Salt Bag Pilot is being developed instead of previous arrangements. Every parish that has requested a new salt bin is being refused but offered the opportunity to enter into the Pilot instead. Those that partake in the Pilot will be given one salt bag (1 ton), which they must store securely. The parish can then decide how and where the salt is distributed. Every parish that participates will be guaranteed one salt bag refill over the winter season. At present more than 40 parishes have signed up to the pilot.</p>
